Here at Nun's Cross, we are committed to always doing better and to do this each year, we engage in a self-evaluation of the education we are providing. This time last year, upon reflection on the year gone by and informed by teacher observations and standardised test results, we set our learning focus on phonemic awareness for the junior end of the school and spelling as our senior end focus. We are delighted to see that our efforts in these areas have shown great improvements across the school, with the spelling standard rising and the phonemic awareness skills in the junior end also improving. While these targets will continue to be emphasised next year, we have also set a whole school well-being focus for next year and will be working on lots of different projects to enhance the well-being of our school community.

Book Scheme

For the coming school year, following the guidelines from the Department of Education, there will be no monetary charge to cover the cost of any books, workbooks, copies, folders, readers, homework journals, maths equipment, novels, dictionaries, atlases etc. for any of the children. The cost for all of the above, along with various subscriptions to teaching and learning websites and programmes, will be covered under the Book Scheme Grant provided by the Department. A copy of our Book Scheme policy is available to view in the office.

As specified in the quidance from the Department and following a financial review, it is not possible for additional costs to be absorbed by the grant at this time. Therefore, the following items are not included:

- Stationery for 1st-6th (each child will need their own pencil case with general stationery supplies)
- Arts and Crafts Supplies for the year €20 - Annual Photocopying Fee - €10
- Music Generation fee €20
- -Pupil Protector Insurance €8

An invoice for the above fees will be issued in September.

The infants enjoyed a trip to Kia Ora Mini Farm in Gorey, 1st and 2nd Class had an adventurous day in Clara Lara, 3rd/4th Class went to The Stables Health and Fitness in Gorey and 4th/5th and 6th had great fun in Emerald Park. Creative Day







Class Teacher 2023-2024



The Board of Management consists of 8 members, 2 of which are parent representatives. The current Board's term ends in November and we will seek new volunteers to form the next Board. Over the course of the year, the Board met 7 times to discuss a range of matters arising with regards to the running of Nun's Cross National School. The following is an agreed annual report from the Board of Management regarding to the schools operations for the 2022-2023 academic year.

• Health and Safety:

- o The Board conducted the Child Protection oversight report at each meeting.
- o Stay Safe programme covered in all classes.
- Anti-bullying policy was discussed at each meeting. The school has adopted several programmes throughout the school to ensure that incidents of bullying are prevented.
- o Fire drills and safety audits have been completed as necessary.
- o All staff and senior classes were trained in first aid.
- Efforts to improve the safety of the footpaths leading to the school have resulted in the grass verges being scraped back which provides more walking space on the footpaths. A working group has been established which will continue work on improving the footpaths leading to school.

• Staffing:

- Nun's Cross secured an additional permanent teaching post this year which
 was filled by Mary Goode. Mrs Goode commenced maternity leave in October
 and has been replaced by Ms Vickers for the remainder of the year.
- Mrs Jebb has been on leave this year and her position has been covered by Ms Doyle
- Mrs Nolan commenced maternity leave in March and is due to return to work in the first term of the next academic year. This year her leave has been covered by Ms Cahier.
- We have a shared SET position with Gaelscoil which will remain in place for the coming academic year.
- Following an appeal, Nun's Cross gained an increase in our Additional Needs Assistance allocation which has been filled by Lena Harte.
- Following the staffing schedule for the school year 2023-2024 issued by the Department of Education, the staffing schedule for next year remains unchanged for Nun's Cross.
- We have appealed our allocation of SET teaching hours and SNA's provision for the coming year.

• Policy Development:

- In line with the policy review schedule the following policies were developed, reviewed, and updated, with staff and parent consultation sought where appropriate/necessary:
 - GDPR
 - Book Scheme
 - Critical Incidents
 - Job Share
 - Anti-bullying
 - Child Protection

• Curricular Development:

- Junior end of the school focused on phonemic awareness* while the senior end focused on spellings.
- A play-based approach has been adopted through the whole junior end of the school.
- All staff took part in curricular training provided by the Department for the Primary Language Curriculum
- School Self Evaluation has continued with focus groups, containing children from 1st- 6th participating to inform progress.
- Standardised tests have been completed by all classes and submitted to the Department. Scores were reviewed by the Board. Interventions for next year have been informed by results as well as timetable changes.
- We did the Irish for the first time and the scores for 2nd, 4th and 5th all came back average, despite a poor attitude towards Gaeilge among the children.
- o Next year's focus will be well-being and data collection is currently under way

• School Inspection:

- Nun's Cross had a one-day incidental inspection from the school inspector in term 2. Feedback from this saw the following:
 - School culture is very positive with positive relationships being observed between children, between children and staff and between staff.
 - School inspector recommended that children receiving additional support from SET teachers should receive support in their classrooms as opposed to being withdrawn for support.

• School Development:

- Nun's Cross has finalised building plans to build one classroom and a special needs unit. This building project is fully funded by the Department of Education, and it is hoped that building works will commence during the next academic year.
- Nun's Cross have been kindly gifted a piece of land to the rear of the school by Stephen Collier. This will enable an extension of our outdoor space to proceed, and we hope for it to be in use for the next academic year.

• Parents Teacher Association:

O The Board wish to thank all members of the PTA for their continued efforts to support the school by organising various events and fundraising days over the course of the year. The money raised this year will go towards the costs of transforming our new piece of land into an exciting play space for all the children in the school.
